The contractor is actively working in multiple areas of the City. Please see below for the current status:

- 1. <u>Main Street West</u>: The street is built up to gravel. Concrete crews are expected on Monday next week.
- 2. <u>Park Avenue N</u>: Utility work is complete and the contractor will begin excavation and restoration of the street section next week.
- 3. <u>Centre Street</u>: The street is built up to gravel. Concrete crews are expected on Monday next week.
- 4. <u>Hilltop Street</u>: The contractor anticipates completion of sanitary sewer today. Sanitary services will be next with completion anticipated next week along with some minor storm sewer and water main repairs. Restoration of the street section is likely the following week.
- 5. <u>Various Streets</u>: Most streets in the project area have been completed for utilities, concrete, and bituminous pavement. Some have been topsoiled and seeded while others are still being restored with topsoil. The contractor will complete additional restoration as needed including additional topsoil, seeding, watering, and weed spraying. The contractor will start some mowing areas as necessary.

The contractor has seeded some areas of the project. They are responsible for the first 60 days of maintenance including watering every week. Residents may assisting with watering but should refrain from mowing the grass as it grows until it is at least 6 inches tall. The first mowings should be at the highest setting for the mower.
